PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

SPEEDWATCH CAMPAIGN

The previously defunct Cocking Speedwatch Campaign has recently been reinstated.

Following police training of the new team along with the supply of safety equipment and a speed gun we started roadside sessions in December 2023.

To date we have checked the speed of 1,667 vehicles (all travelling along the A286 in a southerly direction i.e. towards Chichester). Of these only 5 were travelling above the allowable speed limit and they will have received written warnings from the police.

As the days get longer and the size of our team grows (we are currently 8 with 3 others being trained) we plan to increase the number of roadside sessions we run. We will hold sessions on different days of the week and at different times, so that people who regularly drive through the village know that they might be checked but cannot be sure when.

We are also currently awaiting police approval for a second location in the village which will enable us to check the speed of traffic heading north along the A286 towards Midhurst.



Whilst the number of speeding tickets issued to date is very small, the team does believe it is providing a valuable service to the village by convincing drivers to obey the 30mph speed limit or run the risk of being caught.
